Adult Ambulatory Respiratory Clinic (AARC25)

This month we responded to increasing respiratory demand in Leeds, particularly Influenza, working with West Yorkshire ICB, Yorkshire Ambulance Service and Local Care Direct to mobilise AARC25.



This short term service was implemented from 2nd to 19th January to reduce increasing pressures on Emergency Services and Departments.

Thanks to our existing relationships with partners across the local health economy we were able to mobilise AARC25 within 5 hours of the request from the ICB.

For these three weeks we provided on the day acute assessment for patients (aged 16 and over) that presented with acute respiratory illness.

Post Exposure Prophylaxis MMR Clinic



There are increasing numbers of patients testing positive for measles in Leeds.

As part of a city wide response

we have been working with West Yorkshire ICB and Public Health to mobilise a short-term MMR Post Exposure Prophylaxis (PEP) clinic for patients that are unvaccinated, but have come into contact with a positive case.

This community-based service will operate until 8th March 2025, ensuring patients can access timely vaccination within the recommended 72hour post exposure window.

General Practice Booking Information

The clinic is open to booking from Leeds Teaching Hospitals NHS Trust, the UK Health Security Agency (UKHSA), and now general practice.

If you are contacted by UKHSA and asked to provide PEP to an unvaccinated patient that has been exposed to measles you can book patients directly into these appointments via the Confed Enhanced Access platform and under the site labelled 'MMR PEP'.
